
The Children's Garden at St Mary's

Behind an old gate in our school playground lies one of the school's most exciting projects - The restoration of the 'Children's Garden'. With 'Roots Garden Centre' from Taplow behind us and the Lewis Family's support with transportation it has, finally, all started to come together! All we need now are Gardeners!

Update:

Although a long way off from completion, the good news is that the garden is very nearly at a stage where we can get the children in to do their magic. However, to turn what is currently a blank canvas into the mosaic of wonder and learning that we hope to create, we are going to need a lot of on-going advice and support.

Help will also be needed with the next phase of the rebuild which will involve the construction of a new pond, shed, butterfly house and greenhouse.

We have designed the garden as follows:

1. To be wheelchair / disabled / elderly / young / infirm friendly
2. To be a Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter Garden with a huge Green House
3. To have 5 Paved 'Teaching Islands' (No Muddy Boots) and 4 'Teaching Zones' (Muddy Boots!)
4. To have a Kitchen Garden, a Herb Garden, a Flower Garden, a Science Garden, a Water Garden & a Rose Garden along with Decking, Seating Areas and Shelter from the Rain.

All ideas, old spades, barrows, cuttings, advice, help, welcome – no matter how small; the best gardens in the world belong to everyone!

Olive Wood Carvings from the Holyland: The weekend 2nd / 3rd June we have the Good Shepherd Company from the Holy land (Bethlehem) which is based in Nottingham visiting the Parish at all Masses. They work alongside with St. Vincent De Paul society for orphans and elderly in the Holyland. Our goal is to support and help the Christian families in the holy land to stay at work as olive wood carvers is one of the most important source of income for them, as 90% of the Christians rely on this sale. So by selling their produce here from the olive wood (rosaries, crosses, cribs and religious statues) in their behalf, this will prevent the Christians to leave the country in search of better work opportunities, as a test survey from the bishops of Jerusalem there is only forty one thousands Christians left in the area as well as all the craft men has a small association which help to pay for the poor and needy especially those who in need for medical care as we don't have a welfare system to support them.
