When we go through challenges, we might often find ourselves asking God: "Please give me a sign that I will get through this. Give me a sign that all will be well. Give me a sign that you have not forgotten me." In these last days of Advent God is reminding us of the sign he gave to Ahaz, which was fulfilled in Mary: "Emmanuel, God with us" and the angels to the shepherds: "This will be a sign to you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger".

Advent and Christmas remind us once again that God is truly with us in the nitty gritty routine of daily life. There's a story of a little boy frightened by thunder. During a storm, he ran to his parents' room. His mother said: "Don't be afraid. God is with you." He replied, "I know, but I want someone with skin on!" That's exactly what we celebrate in this grace filled season. In Jesus, God has "skin on". While remaining true God, he has become true man and immersed himself in our human experience. He comes close enough to touch our wounds, close enough to walk our streets, close enough to cry our tears. In the Eucharist, Jesus who once lay in a manger, is now humbly in the Host. St. John Vianney once said that if we truly understood the Eucharist, we would die of joy. God is with us so completely that He becomes our food, our Bread of Life.

When, like Ahaz and Joseph, we go through our own moments of turmoil and fear, let's remember: He is with us. When we carry our burdens: He is with us. When we sit in adoration and wonder if our prayers are heard: He is with us. When we leave the church and step into our daily routine: He walks with us, within us. Faith in Emmanuel does not remove our struggles; it reframes them. When we face difficulties like loneliness, misunderstandings, the monotony of our routine, we have only to remember: "God is with us". That simple truth changes the way we face daily life. Every moment becomes Eucharistic – a thanksgiving, a communion, a presence. We stop waiting for God to appear in grand miracles and begin to recognize Him in the small gestures of love, the hidden sacrifices, the quiet faithfulness of each day.

Belief in Emmanuel isn't a comforting theory. It's a radical way of living – seeing the invisible, loving the unnoticed, and trusting the unseen God who has chosen to dwell with us, not just at Christmas, but in every heartbeat of our life.

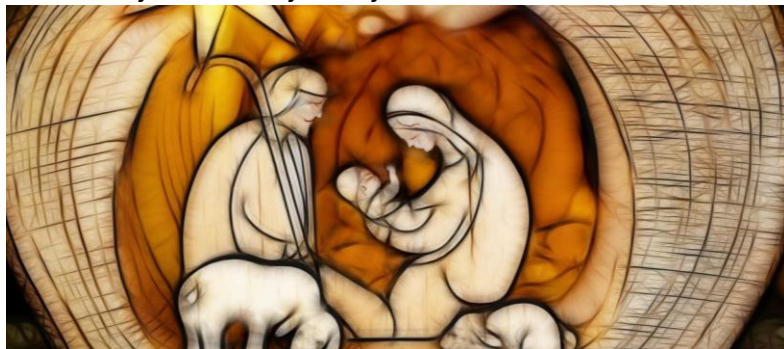

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph

28 Dec 2025

The whole process of Jesus's birth and infancy was surrounded by difficulty and today's Gospel contains one memorable element. We know that Herod the Great was an insecure, ruthless and cunning man. He was an effective builder – he rebuilt the Jerusalem Temple – but he was cruel, vicious and violent. He murdered members of his own family and, following the Holy Family's 'escape to Egypt', he slaughtered the 'Holy Innocents' whose feast would have been today. Jesus escaped but history tells us that he could have been in real danger.

In our time and culture, family life has its joys and its sorrows. The members of the Holy Family experienced tribulation as well and our celebration of their memory today invites us all to have courage and hope whatever the difficulty we face. The example of the Holy Family, and of Mary and Joseph particularly, speaks of a faith and trust in the goodness and providence of God that perseveres. It speaks of patience and that fruit of prayer which is to recognise the hand of God guiding us and bringing everything to a good outcome. Family life will encounter the challenges of life in their many forms. One of those challenges, as we know too well, is separation and brokenness. Relationships do not always persevere in stability and unity. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to manifest compassion, forgiveness, welcome and support for all those whose family lives are seriously disrupted. And as catechists, and those who support the faith development of the young, we must be diligent in our care for those who suffer family breakdown and even abuse. In our parish communities, that same welcome and support must be offered to those who find themselves living without the support and affection of a family. For many, the parish community is their only family.



Each time we celebrate infant baptism, the parents of the child are reminded that they "accept the responsibility of training their child in the practice of the faith. It will be their duty to bring up their child to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbour". The two words 'responsibility' and 'duty' are heavyweight terms because they indicate how indispensable the family is in imparting the faith, both in terms of knowledge, and a living relational faith in Jesus, to a child. The Church is clear in presenting 'Family Catechesis' as prior and foundational. It comes before any other formation or education that we offer as a diocese, a community or the Church. Nothing can replace it and if it is missing other efforts and resources spent on the catechesis of the young will lack full effectiveness. Let us be effective and generous in encouraging and supporting Catholic parents in this fundamental responsibility.

Confirmation & First Holy Communion Classes: As you may be aware, the Confirmation and FHC journeys are in three stages. Stage 1: come to Mass for the last number of months and participating in the prayers and singing, and being comfortable with the journey of liturgy. At the end of each Mass, the candidates received an attendance stamp. This will continue. The family/child will need to show the priest or catechist their Mass Attendance Card. If there is consistency, then the child will be invited into Stage Two, which are the classes. If not, and there seems no interest in Mass attendance, then the child and family will be asked to postpone the reception of the Sacrament for another year.

○ **FHC Stage 2:** First class in **SJ: 9.30am 11 Jan** / SEC: 4.30pm 10 Jan. Classes will be followed by Mass and official enrolment for the First Holy Communion programme.

💧 **Confirmation Stage 2** Eligible Candidates will begin this stage **Saturday 24 Jan 4.30pm at SEC** school. Bring along your Mass attendance cards. A letter and an update of dates have been sent out to their families recently. Please note the requirements to enter Stage Two of the programme. We continue to pray for them.

✠ **OCIA:** We are blessed with having eighteen candidates join the OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults). These are made up of people from Holy Family Parish, Maidenhead & Twyford. They are all involved with our church community. Some desire to be baptised, others to be received into the Catholic church from another church, and some are Catholics who desire to complete their Initiation process by the Sacrament of Confirmation. All we be fully initiated at the Easter Vigil, April 4th, 2026. Classes are beginning. We continue to pray for them.
